Keith is making a mark

STILL on the up-and-up down under is Norwich vocalist Keith Lamb, who left these shores to find fame and fortune in Australia three years ago this Wednesday.

Keith, of whom we have reported from time to time since then, is still with the Sydney-based band, Hush, but guitarist Robin Jackson—who emigrated with him — has settled into life in a record shop.

Keith wrote one side of the last Hush single—a song called "The one man," which was well liked on the radio—and is again responsible for composition of one side of the band's new disc, due to have been recorded this last week-end.

He celebrated his 21st birthday in January and recently tripped to Canberra with Hush for a summer pop festival.

Hard days are far behind for the group, who are now touring in spots of down half an hour when they play venues and bookies try their best to bring in a healthy output.
